They practiced basic stitches such as chain stitch and outline work, which form the foundation of Aari embroidery. As the training progressed, students explored decorative techniques including beadwork, stone fixing, and sequin application. These activities encouraged them to pay close attention to detail and to work with patience and precision. By the end of the session, students were able to create simple motifs and border designs that showcased their growing confidence and artistic ability. The training proved to be both engaging and enriching, allowing students to appreciate the beauty of traditional crafts while developing skills that can be useful for future creative or vocational pursuits.



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JEWELLERY MAKING AND MEHANDI WORKSHOP
